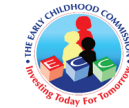

The Government of Jamaica, through a loan from the World Bank, has received financing to support the implementation of the **National Strategic Plan for Early Childhood Development (2013-2018)**. The Early Childhood Commission (ECC) intends to apply a portion of the funds for eligible payments under the contracts for which this invitation is issued.

The ECC now wishes to establish a database of firms from which to select suitable consultants to invite to provide consulting services. The objective of this consultancy is to develop a resource mobilization strategy for sustained financing of Early Childhood Development (ECD) leading to increased financing for related programmes and activities. The strategy is expected to support improvement in the financing conditions for the EC Sector, as well as contribute directly to the achievement of the targets set under the **National Strategic Plan (2013-2018)** and ensure sustained viability of the sector after the implementation of the **NSP (2013-2018)**. Expressions of interest are invited from consultants /firms with the following academic qualification:

Post graduate training in Accounting, Economics and/or Business Management. Consultants/Firms should also possess at least 3 years experience in the following:

- Conducting relevant research, data analysis and report writing.
- Experience in finance and developing financial models
- Project management skills.

The Government of Jamaica (GOJ) through the Ministry of National Security (MNS) and with financing from the Inter-American Development Bank, the UK Department for International Development (DFID) and the Department of Foreign Affairs Trade and Development (DFATD) of Canada is implementing the Citizen Security and Justice Programme III (CSJP III). The programme seeks to enhance citizen security and justice in fifty (50) volatile and vulnerable communities across eight parishes.

The CSJP III is guided by three principal objectives; (i) **improve behaviour for non-violent conflict resolution;** (ii) **increase labour market attachment among youth;** and (iii) **increase access to effective community and alternative justice services.** The MNS has been designated the Executing Agency for the Programme and the Programme Execution Unit (PEU) of this Ministry is also responsible for the implementation of this phase of the programme. The activities under objectives (i) and (ii) will be carried out by the MNS while those activities under objective (iii) will be implemented by the Ministry of Justice (MOJ).

In order to achieve the objectives of the CSJP III, a number of violence prevention and interruption activities are to be implemented; many of which are to be done in collaboration with other Ministry Departments and Agencies (MDAs), Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs), Community Based Organisations (CBOs) and Faith-Based Organizations. However, these implementation activities are to be delivered using a Case Management approach that will enable assessment of the individuals to be served, planning of the types of services to be offered, the duration of each service, progress monitoring, demographics, inter alia. Such information gathering and reporting activities are to be facilitated through the implementation of a case management system.

The Ministry of National Security Citizen Security & Justice Programme invites eligible firms (“Consultants”) to indicate their interest in providing this case management solution. The selected solution will be a comprehensive case management system with reporting capabilities for tracking participant outcomes. Specific user requirements will be identified through a further needs assessment, but basic functional needs include the ability to:

- Register participants with intake information
- Develop service plans for participants
- Track each participant’s activity history
- Enter individualized case notes and store documents
- Alert case managers of participant engagement timelines
- Assess client risk level based on tracked characteristics
- Produce casework reports, letters, and forms that are populated with case data
- Produce reports on outcomes
- Integration with similar systems within other programmes

The system will be used initially in 5 locations and must support use by a minimum of 25 users. However, the locations and number of users are expected to gradually increase after successful completion of the pilot phase.

Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required capabilities, compatible products, and relevant experience to perform the services described above.

Short lists shall comprise six firms with a wide geographic spread, with no more than two firms from any one country. Consultants will be selected in accordance with the procedures set out in the **Inter-American Development Bank: Policies for the Selection and Contracting of Consultants financed by the Inter-American Development Bank GN-2350-9** and is open to all eligible bidders as defined in the policies.

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the **Quality-and Cost Based Selection (QCBS) method** set out in the Consultant Policies. Consultants may associate with other firms in the form of a joint venture or a sub-consultancy to enhance their qualifications. For the purpose of establishing the short list, the nationality of a firm is that of the country in which it is legally incorporated or constituted and in the case of Joint Venture, the nationality of the firm appointed to represent it.
