The Ministry of Finance and the Public Service in collaboration with the Organization of American States (OAS), as Technical Secretariat of the Inter-American Network on Government Procurement (INGP), invites you to participate in the **XII Annual Inter-American Network on Government Procurement (INGP) Conference, to be held at the Montego Bay Convention Centre from November 29-30, 2016, under the theme "Public Procurement: A Tool for Economic Development"**.

The INGP is a group composed of governmental institutions, represented by the national directors of the thirty-four countries of Latin America and the Caribbean who, at the national level, have the ultimate responsibility regarding the regulation, management and modernization of government procurement; as well as institutions that provide institutional and financial support such as the Organization of American States (OAS), the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) and the International Development Research Center (IDRC).

The Annual Conference will:

- Outline activities that are needed to strengthen public procurement in the region;
- Highlight the issues affecting Medium, Small and Micro Enterprises (MSMEs) as it regards to public procurement in the region;
- Provide an avenue for networking for both private and public sector interests;
- Enable the exchange of experiences and lessons learned among countries of the Latin America and Caribbean region.
- Promote development in areas of common interests and forge working alliance between procurement Networks.
- Allow for the presentation and review of current regional initiatives aimed at supporting Caribbean countries in their modernization.

To provide procurement stakeholders the opportunity to participate in the analysis of lessons learned and best practices from leading institutions, and strengthen their capacity to define strategies and implement programmes/projects that will modernize public procurement in a sustainable manner.

The Government of Jamaica (GOJ) has received loan financing from the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) towards the cost of the Strategic Public Sector Transformation Project (SPSTP) and intends to apply part of the proceeds for consulting services. The Project Development Objective (PDO) is to strengthen public resource management and support selected public sector institutions in facilitating a more enabling environment for private sector growth.

The purpose of this assignment is to conduct a Strategic Review of the Ministry of National Security, and develop the related plans for the Ministry's change management strategy. In developing plans for managing the recommended change for the Ministry, the Consultant will develop a Change Management strategy to effect the needed change in the organisation.

In carrying out the Strategic Review, the Consultant will be required to:

- Conduct a Prior Options Review to determine the most effective and efficient arrangement for functions under the Ministry's portfolio;
- Conduct an organisational review that assesses the strategic framework for the Ministry and develops proposals for high-level business process changes;
- Produce a Strategic Review Report that presents the detailed findings of the Review and provides solid proposals for transforming of the Ministry.

The consultancy will have duration of 6 months.
