In keeping with the Government's commitment to strengthen and promote Public Procurement, the Ministry of Finance and the Public Service (MOF&PS), Office of Public Procurement Policy (OPPP) is on a drive to expand the use of the Government of Jamaica Electronic Procurement System (GOJEP) to its suppliers of goods, services and works. This is in keeping with the commitment of the Government to all procurement opportunities published and managed through GOJEP.

Suppliers are being urged to register their businesses in GOJEP and take advantage of the free training sessions facilitated by the Ministry of Finance and the Public Service in the use of the system during the month of August.

Tank #113 is an API 650 constructed Heavy Fuel Oil HFO storage tank, which is 158' in diameter and 47'-6" high, and has coned roof supported by columns. The storage capacity is 167,500 Barrels. In this regard, experienced contractors are invited to submit bids to complete the subject works.

A **mandatory** Site Visit will be held on **Tuesday, March 17, 2020 at 10:00 a.m.** at the Petrojam Limited's Kingston Refinery located at 96 Marcus Garvey Drive, Kingston 15. **The failure of a bidder to attend the mandatory site visit will result in rejection of the bid.**

The Government of Jamaica (GOJ) has received financing from the World Bank towards the cost of Strategic Public Sector Transformation Project (SPSTP), and intends to apply part of the proceeds for the **selection of a firm to undertake the transformation of the Companies Office of Jamaica Project (TCOJP).**

The Strategic Public Sector Transformation Project (SPSTP), in collaboration with the Companies Office of Jamaica (COJ), is inviting proposals from qualified firms to offer services for a functional/organization review and restructuring of the COJ, and a radical redesign and modernization of all business processes, with the purpose of raising the business efficiency and effectiveness at all levels across the Agency. The ultimate objective is to improve the ease of doing business in Jamaica by creating an enabling environment for local and international investors to fuel economic growth in keeping with the priority objective of the GOJ. This would also contribute to Jamaica receiving a better ranking on the Ease of Doing Business Index.

The specific objective is for the firm to manage the implementation of the restructuring of the COJ in order to respond to the needs of the revised business processes resulting from the review. The consultancy will have a duration of **twelve (12) months.**

The Ministry of Finance and the Public Service now invites eligible Consulting Firms ("Consultants") to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. Required qualifications and experience include:

- Consultant firms shall demonstrate a minimum of five (5) years of experience in the areas of Business Process Re-engineering, Business Analysis, and Systems Analysis.
- Consultant firms shall demonstrate a minimum of five (5) years of experience in Change Management.
- A minimum of three (3) similar assignments in the last seven (7) years.

Key Experts will not be evaluated at the shortlisting stage.

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to Section III, paragraphs, 3.14, 3.16, and 3.17 of the World Bank's "Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers" July 2016, Revised November 2017 and August 2018 ("Procurement Regulations"), setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.

Consultants may associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications, but should indicate clearly whether the association is in the form of a joint venture and/or a sub-consultancy. In the case of a joint venture, all the partners in the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable for the entire contract, if selected.
