INVITATION TO BID

The Government of Jamaica (GOJ) has received financing from the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) – United Kingdom Caribbean Infrastructure Partnership Fund (UKCIF), in an amount equivalent to £16,710,313 towards the cost of the Southern Plains Agricultural Development Project (SPAD) and intends to apply a portion of the proceeds of this financing to eligible payments under a contract for which this invitation is issued. Payments by CDB will be made only at the request of GOJ and upon approval by CDB, will be subject in all respects to the terms and conditions of the Financing Agreement. The Financing Agreement prohibits withdrawal from the financing account for the purpose of any payment to persons or entities, or for any import of goods, if such payment or import, to the knowledge of CDB, is prohibited by a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations. No party other than GOJ shall derive any rights from the Financing Agreement or have any claim to the proceeds of the Financing.

SPAD is being implemented by the Ministry of Agriculture & Fisheries (MoAF) through a dedicated Project Execution Unit (PEU), and forms part of the GOJ Infrastructure Development Programme. It seeks to provide enhanced irrigation systems and services to an estimated 795 hectares of land in Parnassus, Clarendon, and Bridge Pen/Amity Hall in St. Catherine.

MoAF now invites interested eligible firms to submit Bids for the Supply of GIS Equipment consisting of Drones and GPS.

Suppliers shall be eligible to participate if:

- (A) In the case of a body corporate, it is legally incorporated or otherwise organised in an eligible country, has its principal place of business in an eligible country and is more than 50 per cent beneficially owned by citizen(s) and/or bona fide resident(s) of eligible country(ies) or by a body(ies) corporate meeting these requirements; in the case of unincorporated firms, the persons are citizens or bona fide residents of an eligible country;
- (B) In all cases, the Contractor has no arrangement and undertakes not to make any arrangements, whereby any substantial part of the net profits or other tangible benefits of the contract will accrue or be paid to a person not a citizen or *bona fide* resident of an eligible country; and

Eligible countries are member countries of CDB. The attention of interested bidders is drawn to paragraph 1.09 of the CDB's Guidelines for Procurement (2011), setting forth CDB's policy on Eligibility.

To be eligible, **local entities**/representatives for the supply of GIS Equipment are required to be currently registered with the Public Procurement Commission and must possess a **valid Tax Compliance Letter/Certificate**. This requirement does not apply to bidders outside of Jamaica prior to the submission of bids.

In the assessment of submissions, consideration will be given to compliance with technical specifications, availability of spare parts and warranty. All information must be submitted in English.

The sealed envelope containing each submission should include the name and address of the bidder on the outside of the envelope and shall be clearly marked "EQUIPMENT SUPPLY – GIS".

Bidders "shall" have the option of submitting their bids electronically to SPADProcurement@ nicjamaica.com as well as hard copies to the National Irrigation Commission Project Office above on or before 3:00 p.m. on Friday, January 22, 2021. The burden of proving receipt of the e-mail will be on the applicant and will not be met solely by a read receipt or sent items report generated by the bidder's computer. Bids shall be valid for a period of 120 days after bid closing.

Bids will be opened in the presence of the Bidders' representatives who choose to attend in person at the address above at **3:15 p.m. Friday, January 22, 2021** in the Project Meeting Room at the above address. **LATE BIDS WILL BE REJECTED.**
