The late Constable Fairclough displayed great courage in the face of extreme danger. He went above and beyond the call of duty, to challenge an armed man who shot and injured a vendor, in St. Ann on Monday, April 15, 2024. During an

ensuing gun battle, Constable Fairclough was shot and later died in hospital. His action in saving the life of the vendor is deemed heroic.
