EXCLUSIVE USE OF THE GOVERNMENT OF JAMAICA ELECTRONIC PROCUREMENT (GOJEP) SYSTEM

In keeping with the Government's commitment to strengthen, promote and enhance the Public Procurement system, the Ministry of Finance and the Public Service (MOFPS), through the Office of Public Procurement Policy (OPPP), has officially mandated the use of the e-Procurement System for procurement transactions exceeding One Million, Five Hundred Thousand Jamaican Dollars (\$1,500,000.00), effective as of August 01, 2023. Suppliers interested in conducting business with the Government of Jamaica are now required to access and submit procurement documents through the Government of Jamaica Electric Procurement (GOJEP) system. The OPPP is providing continuous and dedicated support to suppliers, and is pleased to announce the commencement of its annual free virtual supplier training series for the 2023-24 financial year. All interested suppliers are encouraged to partake in this initiative. Virtual sessions will run from October 2023-February 2024.

These sessions are designed to empower participants with the knowledge and skills required to effectively support the navigating, administering and managing of the GOJEP system. Each session is four (4) hours in length, and integrates interactive discussions, covering topics such as supplier self-registration, electronic bid submission and supplier account management.

Abstract:

The Government of Jamaica has established a Security Strengthening Project (SSP), funded by a Loan from the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), the main objective of which is to contribute to an increase in the conviction rate for murders in Jamaica. The strategy to achieve the main objective will be the "specific objectives":

- (i) To assist in the reduction of the rate of murders in the country;
- (ii) To increase the proportion of police investigations of murders that result in prosecution;
- And
- (iii) The training of police officers in the use of technology in crime fighting.

The Security Strengthening Project has three (3) components:

- (i) **Component 1** - Violent crime prevention and management;
- (ii) **Component 2** - Improving investigative capabilities for homicides;
- (iii) **Component 3** - Change Management & Communications.

The Project components comprise activities to benefit and involve the participation of the Ministry of National Security and the following entities within its portfolio:

- The Jamaica Constabulary Force (JCF)
- The Department of Correctional Services (DCS)
- The Firearm Licensing Authority (FLA)
- Passport, Immigration, Citizenship Agency (PICA)
- The Institute of Forensic Science and Legal Medicine (IFSLM)
- The Private Security Regulation Authority (PSRA).

Additional entities outside the portfolio of the Ministry of National Security includes

- The National Works Agency (NWA)
- eGov Jamaica Limited (eGov).

The Ministry of National Security has received financing from the IDB, and it intends to apply part of the proceeds to payments under the project Security Strengthening Project (SSP), for the engagement of a Final Evaluation, Technical Specialist Consultant.

The Ministry of National Security now invites suitably qualified consultants to submit their Curricula Vitae (CV) for the role of Final Evaluation, Technical Specialist Consultant. Your CV must include details of your relevant experience and qualifications to perform the services.

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the procedures set out in the Inter-American Development Bank: Policies for the Selection and Contracting of Consultants financed by the Inter-American Development Bank GN-2350-15 for individual consultants.

Consultancy Objectives:

The Final Evaluation of the project seeks to determine the degree of compliance with the Project's objective and its results as outlined in Section 5.03 (b) of the Loan Contract. In particular, the Final Evaluation will include an updated version of the activities listed for the intermediate evaluation and the analysis of the:

- i. Project's vertical logic;
- ii. Attribution of results to the Project;
- iii. Relevance between the Project's objectives and the needs of the respective beneficiaries
- iv. the Project sustainability
- v. Ex-post cost-benefit of the Project, also referred to as an ex-post economic analysis
- vi. Project contribution to Bank and national strategic objectives
- vii. Quality of the project's monitoring and evaluation plan
- viii. Project contribution to the strengthening of the Beneficiaries' fiduciary and non-fiduciary country systems.

Minimum Qualification and Experience:
