EXCLUSIVE USE OF THE GOVERNMENT OF JAMAICA ELECTRONIC PROCUREMENT (GOJEP) SYSTEM

In keeping with the Government's commitment promote and enhance the Public Procurement system, the Ministry of Finance and the Public Service (MOFPS), through the Office of Public Procurement Policy (OPPP), has officially mandated the use of the e-Procurement System for procurement transactions exceeding One Million, Five Hundred Thousand Jamaican Dollars (\$1,500,000.00), effective as of August 01, 2023. Suppliers interested in conducting business with the Government of Jamaica are now required to access and submit procurement documents through the Government of Jamaica Electric Procurement (GOJEP) system. The OPPP is providing continuous and dedicated support to suppliers, and is pleased to announce the commencement of its annual free virtual supplier training series for the 2023-24 financial year. All interested suppliers are encouraged to partake in this initiative. Virtual sessions will run from October 2023-February 2024.

These sessions are designed to empower participants with the knowledge and skills required to effectively support the navigating, administering and managing of the GOJEP system. Each session is four (4) hours in length, and integrates interactive discussions, covering topics such as supplier self-registration, electronic bid submission and supplier account management.

Consultant to Develop the National Strategic and Action Plan for Maternal Health

Globally, maternal mortality has been increasing with substantial variation among countries and within countries. Maternal deaths are relatively rare events, even in countries where maternal mortality rates are high. Thus, large sample sizes are needed to estimate both maternal mortality risks and contributors to maternal deaths.

There is a need for closer monitoring of maternal and perinatal morbidity and quality assurance. The development of an updated strategic plan would support the present activities and further define the quality of care offered to the population so that updated evidence-based methodologies can be implemented to achieve the SDG 3.1 target of a MMR of less than 70/100,000 live births

Overall Objectives of the Consultancy

The consultant shall work with the Family Health Unit, the National Surveillance Unit, and its external and internal partners to develop Jamaica's National Strategic and Action Plan for Maternal Health (2025-2030).

Specific Objectives for the Consultancy are to:

- 1. Evaluate the maternal health services in Jamaica 2013-2023
- Develop Jamaica's National Strategic and Action Plan for Maternal Health (2025-2030)
- Develop the implementation and monitoring and evaluation framework.

SCOPE OF WORK

Proposed Methodology:

The consultant is expected to collaborate with various administrative and technical offers at MOHW, the regional health authorities, and the internal and external stakeholders in the private and public domains to prepare a strategic plan to advance maternal health care.

In undertaking this assignment, the consultant is required to:

a. Liaise with key stakeholders in MOHW and the Regions to determine perspective on the draft Maternal Death Surveillance Response Strategic draft Plan; this includes consultations and key informant interviews

- b. Use the findings of PROMAC evaluation, technical reports, and other relevant national and international reference documents to guide the selection of the key maternal health indicators for baseline assessment
- Provide a broad assessment of the current capacity of selected health facilities to provide ongoing reports for the action plan for key maternal health indicators including the current reporting forms for revision
- Develop an evaluation plan
- Evaluate the current maternal health services
- Prepare an evaluation report
- Develop the draft strategic and action plans with the implementation monitoring and evaluation framework
- Finalize the strategic and action plans with the implementation monitoring and evaluation framework
- Prepare PowerPoint presentations with draft strategic and action plans with the implementation monitoring and evaluation framework and the approved strategic and action
