3. Proposal for Jamaica to Host a Seminar Entitled "Enhance Arms Trade Treaty and United Nations Programme of Action Implementation"

Cabinet gave approval for Jamaica to host the seminar in April 2015 entitled "Enhance Arms Trade Treaty (ATT) and United Nations Programme of Action (UNPoA) Implementation by South-South Parliamentary Exchange and Cooperation", under the auspices of the Parliamentary Forum on Small Arms and Light Weapons.

The Parliamentary Forum on Small Arms and Light Weapons was inaugurated in 1999 to create a platform for greater action on small arms and light weapons. It is the only global network of Parliamentarians specifically dedicated to matters of arms control and the prevention of violence. Jamaica has been an active participant in the activities of the Forum since 2009.
