**INVITATION FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST TO
HOST RESIDENTIAL SUMMER CAMP**

The **Government of Jamaica** in focusing its efforts on advancing social development initiated a programme of safety net reform in 2000. The target beneficiaries of the slated improvements in delivery of social services are vulnerable groups within the population. Recognition of the need to mitigate risks and reduce poverty has led to the realization of several gains since the reforms began. **The Programme of Advancement Through Health and Education (PATH)**, a conditional income transfer programme, was developed and implemented in 2002. Since its launch in 2002, PATH has become the Jamaica's flagship social assistance program providing cash transfers to over **380,000 beneficiaries in 2014**.

The Government has sought to deepen gains in Social Assistance delivery through implementation of the **Steps to Work Project** since 2008, to facilitate the transitioning of working-age persons in PATH-supported households to positions of economic independence. Under its **School to Work Transitioning Strategy**, the Project has re-integrated over **2,500 At-Risk Youth** from these households into the Secondary School system through the Annual Summer Camp Intervention.

RESIDENTIAL SUMMER CAMP 2014

This year, the project proposes to treat approximately **one hundred and forty (140)** participants in a single Residential Camp facilitating all parishes. The intervention will be delivered over a period of **2 weeks beginning in mid August**, using a multi-agency approach. The following activities will be facilitated:

- Individual Psychometric Evaluations designed to assist participants to identify their vocational interest areas
- Pre and post intervention assessments in Mathematics and English
- Thirty hours (30) of training in Mathematics and English (combined) at pre CSEC (Grades 9/10) level.
- 35 hours of training in a Vocational Skill using customized curriculum developed by the HEART Trust NTA
- Twenty-four (24) hours of Developmental Career Guidance, Career Counselling and Life Skills Coaching
- Three (3) hours of training in Conflict Resolution (to be delivered by the Dispute Resolution Foundation)
- Enrichment Activities to support the academic/vocational curricula, including a Field Trip, a twenty-four (24) hour Performing Arts curriculum, where the lessons learnt will be further reiterated through performances in music, drama and dance, and a twenty-hour (20) sports curriculum which will provide avenues for the inculcation and reinforcement of life-time values such as citizenship, sportsmanship, teamwork, and positive work ethic.

The major objective will be to identify and prepare a cohort of at-risk youth and provide interventions to prepare them to successfully transition to second chance opportunities to attain minimum standards of Secondary level certification as the basis for further interventions aimed at job readiness and placement once their secondary education has been completed. The intervention will therefore target students who have exited the secondary school system without having attained the basic requirements to enter the Job Market or Post Secondary Educational Institutions.

- Specifically, it will engage students from the target households who:-
- a. exited the secondary school system in the 10th or 11th grade and have not sat the CSEC examinations or
 - b. completed the 11th grade and sat the CSEC examinations, but failed to attain passes in less than five (5) subjects
